

### Superb Reads – Bookshop Report

During the last 12 months donations have continued unabated, the largest single donation being some 50 boxes from the estate of Ian Selliseth. I was happy to have been assisted by Rose & Steve Campbell who offered temporary storage before sorting, recycling & finally delivering the selection to the bookshop. Most of this collection remains to be priced.

There have been some interesting sales such as that of a large bonsai reference collection occupying a whole shelf which I delivered to a housebound collector some 70 kms away who bought the lot for a tidy sum, sight unseen. On New Years' Eve a Melbourne visitor was excited to find 1950's titles by Angela Thirkell & D E Stevenson missing from her collection - these were books which a cursory glance at their unattractive faded appearance may well have relegated them to the recycle bin, so the time-consuming task of checking titles does pay dividends. Recently quite large gaps in the Craft section were explained by purchases made one Saturday morning by teachers from another town.

New Year's takings were down on previous years but a lot of visitors 'discovered' the shop which, except for the quiet hours between midday and 3pm, was kept open from 9 am until 11pm by 6 volunteers - Eve Attwood, Doug Brimble, John Giffard, Judy Ormond, Marion Murray & Averil Kennedy.

A welcome improvement has been the installation of LED lighting arranged by the owner Philippa Schapper. As well, more double-sided steel Library Shelves have been installed by Colin Crane - yes ...to house more books.

Since April this year, because of the absence of customers between 9 & 10am, the Saturday starting time was changed to 10am. Closing time was changed from 12 to 12.30pm. So far there has not been any feedback.

During this last financial year, we sadly lost 2 of our long serving Bookshop volunteers Maureen & Tim Mannion. Both were involved in the establishment of the Bookshop in the late 1980's and made sure the shop continued through many changes of landlords and locations. Our town is indebted to them for their foresight and persistence.

We continue to receive quite a number of books for which customers are prepared to pay quite high prices, even \$100 or more. This has meant that proceeds for this year have reached the amount of \$10,883.25 - \$1294.60 more than the 2021-22 year.
